More Marko polo: If sophomore Marko Spica looks like he doesn't want to be here tonight, he probably doesn't. He originally signed with perennial contender UCLA, but when he couldn't qualify academically, he was out of luck. Forced to give up the glamour of Los Angeles, he settled for the next best place: Mount Pleasant. Wrote Spica after just one semester at CMU: "I hate Mount Pleasant." He later called it "the biggest sheat whol in the world" [sic] because the club scene did not compare to that in Belgrade. To give you some idea of how he passed the time in Mt. Pleasant, he claims to be "as good as anyone" at ping pong, so maybe he's been practicing.

'Fresh' Men: Freshmen Manny "Fresh" Harris and Kelvin "Smooth" Grady have wasted no time adjusting to the college game. Both have started each game of their Wolverine careers and made an instant impact. Of Michigan's 124 assists, Harris and Grady are responsible for 57. Harris leads the team in scoring, assists, steals, and minutes played. Grady has not done so bad himself, shooting a blistering 48% from three-point range and remaining perfect on free throws.

Future looks bright: Two recruits have signed National Letters of Intent to play for Michigan in the 2008-09 season. Ben Cronin, from Syracuse, NY, is a 7-foot center with a 7'5" wingspan. Cronin averaged 12.0 points, 12.0 rebounds, 8.0 assists, and 5.0 blocks as a junior for the Henninger HS Black Knights. Gotta love a player that puts up round numbers like that. Stu Douglass, a 6'3" shooting guard from Carmel, Indiana, also signed with the Wolverines. Douglass put up 10.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 1.0 steals per game last season, and is a 92% free throw shooter. He has played high school games against the likes of Greg Oden, Mike Conley, and Eric Gordon.

Michigan is 12-5 all-time on December 15, including a 6-1 record after 1954.

In games played on December 15 in odd-numbered years, Michigan is 4-2. The most recent game was all the way back in 1979, when Michigan beat Dayton, 69-54.

The lowest-scoring Michigan game played on December 15 was a 32-19 victory at Louisville YHMA in 1923.

The highest-scoring Michigan game played on December 15 was a 96-66 loss at Illinois in 1952.
