When UCLA coach Ben Howland called Michigan “the best 4-8 team in the country,” it was a bit of a backhanded compliment. But after the way the Wolverines played the Bruins—building an eight-point lead at one point in the second half—it became clear that this team’s record does not reflect the progress it has made. With the New Year upon us and the Big Ten season beginning today, never has the Maize and Blue had a better opportunity for a fresh start. The Badgers knocked off Texas in Austin last weekend and will likely be without Trevon Hughes, their leading scorer, today due to an ankle injury. The first big upset of the Beilein era could be today. Go Blue!

44	Kelvin Grady	5'11" G	Recorded a career-high eight assists vs. CMU; his 3.3 assist-to-turnover ratio leads the team and he is a perfect 10-for-10 from the free throw line
3	Manny Harris	6'5" G	Manny leads the team in scoring with 15.7 ppg; in fact, he's scored in double-digits in 11 of his 12 career games
24	Ron Coleman	6'6" W	One of just two seniors on the roster, R.C. is averaging a career best in rebounds (4.8) and assists (1.9); has never missed a game at Michigan
34	DeShawn Sims	6'8" F	Scored 12 points against UCLA on 5-of-9 shooting and has put together a streak of double-digit scoring in each of the last seven games
22	Ekpe Udoh	6'10" F	After just over one year in A ² , Ekpe ranks #9 in UM history with 105 blocks; his 7'3" wingspan has helped him record 11 multi-block games this season

2	C.J. Lee	6'0" G	Posted a 2.5 assist-to-turnover ratio this year in heavy minutes off the bench
11	David Merritt	5'10" G	Senior from West Bloomfield made the team last year at open tryouts
30	Eric Puls	6'10" F	Freshman Alpena-native will redshirt this year
15	Jevohn Shepherd	6'5" W	Air Canada scored seven points and made three steals in 15 min. vs. UCLA
12	Anthony Wright	6'6" F	Ant has only committed one foul this year in 155 minutes

Future looks bright: Two recruits have signed National Letters of Intent to play for Michigan in the 2008-09 season. Ben Cronin, from Syracuse, NY, is a 7-foot center with a 7'5" wingspan. Cronin averaged 12.0 points, 12.0 rebounds, 8.0 assists, and 5.0 blocks as a junior for the Henninger HS Black Knights. Gotta love a player that puts up round numbers like that. Stu Douglass, a 6'3" shooting guard from Carmel, Indiana, also signed with the Wolverines. Douglass put up 10.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 1.0 steals per game last season, and is a 92% free throw shooter. He has played high school games against the likes of Greg Oden and Eric Gordon.

Welcome LLP: Laval Lucas-Perry, a 6'3" freshman guard at Arizona, has transferred to Michigan. Lucas-Perry, who was ranked the #20 point guard by Rivals.com, averaged 26 points, seven rebounds, and six assists as a senior at Flint Powers Catholic High School. He will be eligible to play for the Maize and Blue starting in January 2009.

Michigan is 53-17 all-time in home games against Wisconsin.

In years ending in the number eight, Michigan is 6-0 vs. the Badgers.
