Former Teammates: Starting forward Jack Houpt is a native of Chesterton, Indiana. Summer, Man: For college basketball players, the offseason offers a great opportunity to work on their game away from the team to hone their skills. Exhibit A, Trey Burke, who spent the summer documenting his intense workouts in the Youtube series "Trey Burke Journey to Ann Arbor." For the lucky few, summer means practicing and playing for the U-19 USA basketball team at the U-19 FIBA World Championships in Latvia. One of those lucky few was sophomore guard Tim Hardaway, Jr. Along with players like UConn's Jeremy Lamb and Memphis' Joe Jackson, Hardaway, Jr. played 9 game in 10 days, where he was fifth on the team in scoring (9.4 ppg) shooting 43% for the tournament.
