Home Cooking: If Alabama A&M does one thing well, it is recruit their home state; of the 16 players listed on the roster, 11 of them are from Alabama. In addition to four starters (Tabb is from Greensboro, AL), Justan Banks (#00) is from Oxford, Eddie Hardy (#11) and Derrick Mosley (#35) are from Birmingham, Jose Long (#20) reigns from Madison, Marcus Lee (#24) hails from Newbern, Devin Colman (#45) is from Camden, and Diamon Alexander (#54) is from Huntsville. Surprisingly, Alexander does not appear to be related to our own Bacari Alexander. Diamon does, however, appear to be slightly older than our assistant. The three remaining states represented on the Alabama Agricultural & Mechanical University roster are Georgia, Texas, and New York.

**Former Teammates:** Jerome Hunter should be pretty familiar with fellow sophomore teammate **Reginald Martin** (#50). After attending Queen City Preparatory Academy in Buffalo, NY, Hunter and Martin both committed to play for Alabama A&M and have thus far stuck with their word.

Name Game: After finishing last season at 13-15 (10-8 SWAC), with key wins coming over the likes of Talladega, Tuskegee, and Martin Methodist, the Bulldogs look to new coach Willie Hayes to improve. Unfortunately, Hayes may be spending more time getting his players names straight than he would like. Brandon Ellis and Brandon Allen (#42) and Jeremy Crutcher and Jeremy Ingram (#22) both share first names and are certain to give Hayes fits. Moreover, five players' names start with the letter "J" and four with "D". Good luck getting the names down Willie.

**Trey, for Three:** After the departure of point guard Darius Morris (who has recently signed a contract to play for the Los Angeles Lakers), one of the biggest questions coming into the year was whether or not freshman point guard Trey Burke could come in and contribute. As we sit here just ten games into the season, the answer is a fairly confident yes. Trey is averaging 12.5 points per game off of 44% shooting, including 35% from three-point range. While he has scored double digit points in 8 of the first 10 games, he has shown that he is still a freshman, and freshman do make mistakes. Those mistakes result in turnovers, and Burke is averaging 3 of them per game. Look for those turnover numbers to decrease in the next couple weeks as Trey gets his first taste of Big Ten basketball over break.
