- You do NOT need a physical CD-ROM. Go to Documents Workstations 2-4.
- Click on Icon that says Terminal Services.
- Choose one of the 14 titles.

• XXXXXXXXX DRIVE IS CRUCIAL FOR USING/DOWNLOADING.

These computers do *not* recognize a: c: or d: while you are in a LAN computer.

Create request files in the X drive (if the program requires a request file). Sometimes it's the Y drive, but you should be able to figure it out.

Always download to the X: drive. Once you exit the LAN, access *My Computer* on the desktop and drag data from the X to a: or d: drive



• The CDs are filed in the two large CD cabinets to the east of the Documents Desk.

Look in drawers marked Do, DoX, DVDs, and Software as well as the top of the cabinet.



• Check Documents Computer 5 or the computer as you enter Room 203 J to see if the software is already mounted.

CDs using Extract (for 1987-94 Census Bureau products) must be accessed on the Scholar's Workstation in 203J with a staff member networked logon.

• If the software is NOT mounted, you may:

- Leave a reference request (name and e-mail of patron, call number of CD, and issue of serial) for a full-time staff member to mount the next day.
- Load it yourself on either Documents 5 or in Room 203 J.

• Loading Procedure

- Place CD or DVD in DVD drive
- Click on Start/Run (203J)
- Browse the CD/DVD drive (Docs 5) for a program that ends in .exe (e.g. start.exe, install.exe, setup.exe)

PRACTICE QUESTIONS

- **1. Where is the Census CD 2000 Blocks found physically?** When you find it, you'll notice that the first step it requires is establishing a request file. Which drive should you use for that file?
- **2. Is the CensusCD** + **Maps for 1990 on the library citrix service?** Which drive do you think you should use in the library for creating a request file?
- 3. How would you physically access the June 2000 issue of the National Trade Data Bank?

ANSWERS

1. On the Documents LAN under Census 2000 or under Geolytics. Use the X: drive.

2. Yes. C: is probably locked so use the Client A: or Client D: (zip)

3. Pull from Documents cabinets, DoX6. Then mount on Documents 11.

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
