& World Report claimed, "We cherish our country as a democracy dedicated to the rule of law, religious and political freedom, economic opportunity and respect for the individual.... [those who commit terrorism] furiously resent this." That's what most of us would like to believe: We're the good guys, and anyone who attacks us is evil. When people we don't like put bombs in vehicles and kill scores, we see them as crazed killers. When we put bombs on missiles and kill hundreds, we pretend we're upholding civilized values.

But the truth is that the United States does some pretty awful things in many nations, creating suffering and death to many peoples around the world. In 1975, for example, the Ford Administration approved, aided and abetted Indonesia's brutal slaughter of people in East Timor: one out of three of its people were killed, making it proportionally a worse war crime than Pol Pot's mega-murders in Cambodia. We have orchestrated coups to topple democratically elected leaders in Iran, Chile, Guatemala. We have supported brutal dictators with money and arms. We organized and funded a terroristic war against Nicaraguan civilians.

And today our embargo against the people of Iraq kills 150 children every day, an embargo justified as "putting pressure on the Iraqi people to get rid of Saddam Hussein." In other words, our embargo commits violence against unarmed civilians for political purposes. In another word, our embargo is an example of terrorism on a grand scale.

Small-scale terrorism is fueled by grief and hatred over oppression and wanton large-scale terrorism, almost always at the hands of our nation or our client nations. It is sparked by the desperation of trying to fight back at the most militarily powerful nation in history, one that sanctimoniously invokes international law when its interests are violated. but flouts it when we think mining a harbor or invading a nation or bombing civilians or raining Cruise missiles on a phar-

maceutical plant will serve our interests. Committing terrorism against terrorists is morally wrong and practically counterproductive. If we want a sure defense against terrorism, the only solution is justice. We will never "win" a "war" against terrorism using violence; we will only be safe when we compel our government to act justly in its dealings with other nations and peoples. In fact, given the fact that our country is arguably the world's leading terrorist nation, a good first step would be to dismantle the CIA and most of our military we've projected



- 10. Next morning: eat huge breakfast. Brood on decision to participate in civil disobedience and its ramifications. Return to rally site, prepare for action.
- . Take deep breath and cross line onto fort property.
- $2.\,\mathrm{Suddenly}$ realize that your life feels a little more purposeful than it did a few minutes ago, that perhaps your action may actually help the SOA get closed down, and that you have just joined a long and venerable tradition of rabble-rousing and demonstrating. Continue walking. Feel very, very alive.
- 3. Encounter police; have I.D. ready to hand over. Get processed by them at slow speed.
- 14. Return home and continue with letter-writing campaigns, local demonstrations, and other efforts to publicize cause. Agitate. Ferment.
