MILK CARTONS & JUICE BOXES

CONTAINERS:

RECYCLE THESE

(Empty & Remove Straws)



GLASS & CERAMICS

Detach All Lids

Mugs, Plates, Flower Pots Drinking Glasses, Pyrex Glass Bottles & Jars



CANS, AEROSOLS, and SCRAP METAL

Steel and Aluminum Cans Foil, Metal Jar Lids Pots, Pans, Utensils Aerosol Cans

Scrap Metals up to 1 cubic foot, 20 pounds

Teflon Coatings and Plastic Handles are OK

No Electrical Appliances



PLASTIC BOTTLES

Marked (1) or (2) on Bottom Remove & Discard All Caps

Milk Jugs & Water Bottles Laundry & Shampoo Bottles

BOTTLES ONLY

Do not include plastic bags, trays, cups or margarine tubs!

Do not recycle bottles that have held a toxic material, such as motor oil.

Place the above items inside your Containers recycling bin. All containers must be empty, and rinsed if possible

Clean, used clothing and textiles may be placed inside a sealed, transparent plastic bag and put in the Paper bin for recycling.

> Household batteries, motor oil and motor oil filters are also collected curbside and at the Drop-Off Station.
