Elder Prescription Insurance Coverage (EPIC)

EPIC is a state program to help low-income senior Michigan residents access prescription drugs. Eligibility requirements include: age 65 or over, not currently receiving Medicaid benefits or private prescription drug insurance, not institutionalized, and a resident of Michigan for at least three months.
