

EBP Sustainability State Ranking Survey: Respondent Demographics

Response Rate

At 73.2 percent, the overall response rate for the EBP Sustainability State Ranking Survey was excellent, with 139 individuals responding out of a total of 190 invited to participate. Sixteen of Michigan's 18 PIHPs were represented, with response rates ranging from 50 percent to 88.8 percent as shown in Table 1 below. There appears to be little correlation between response rates and PIHP location, size, or rural-urban service area.

Survey Respondent Demographics

Gender Identification

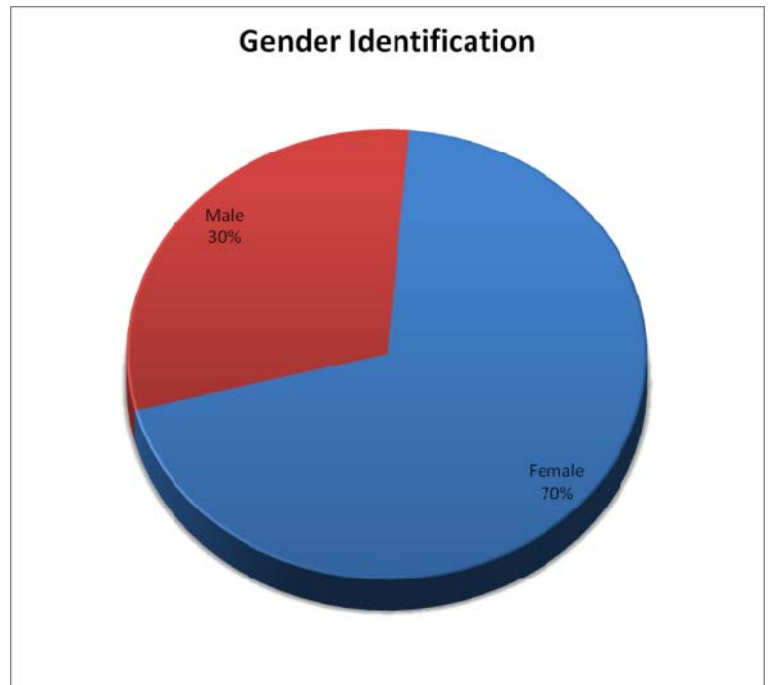


Figure 1: Gender Identification of Respondents

Seventy percent of respondents identified themselves as female and 30 percent identified themselves as male, as shown in Figure 1.

One value was coded as missing (the respondent declined to state).

Racial Identification

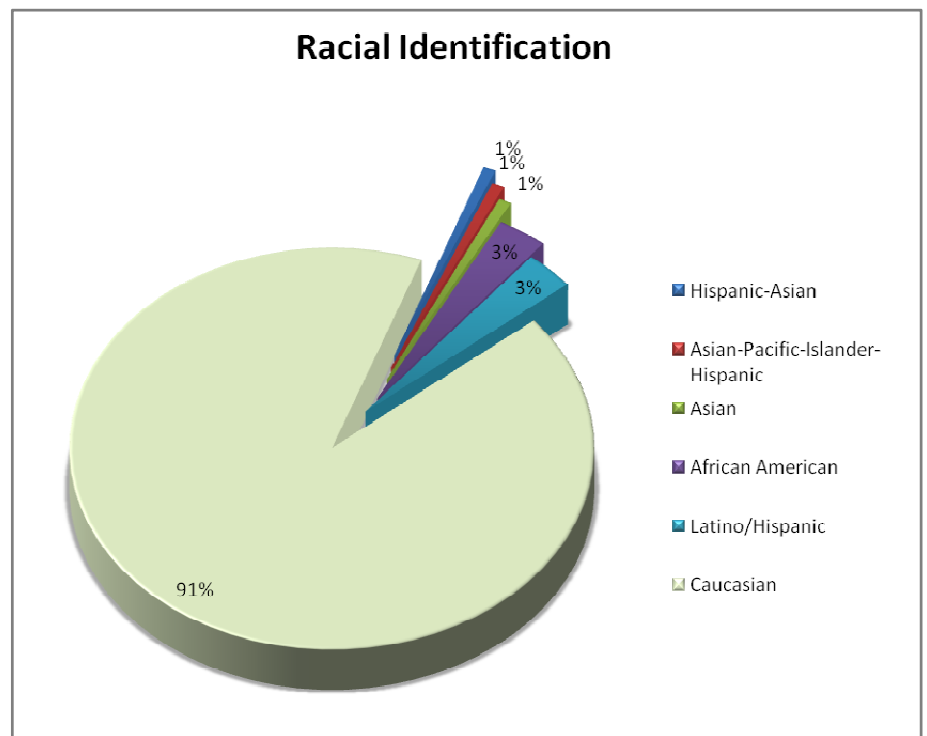


Figure 2: Racial Identification of Respondents

Ninety-one percent of respondents identified themselves as Caucasian, 3 percent as Latino/Hispanic, 3 percent as African American, 1 percent as Asian, 1 percent as Hispanic-Asian, and 1 percent as Asian-Pacific-Islander-Hispanic, as shown in Figure 2.

Nine values were coded as missing (the respondents declined to state).

Age Range

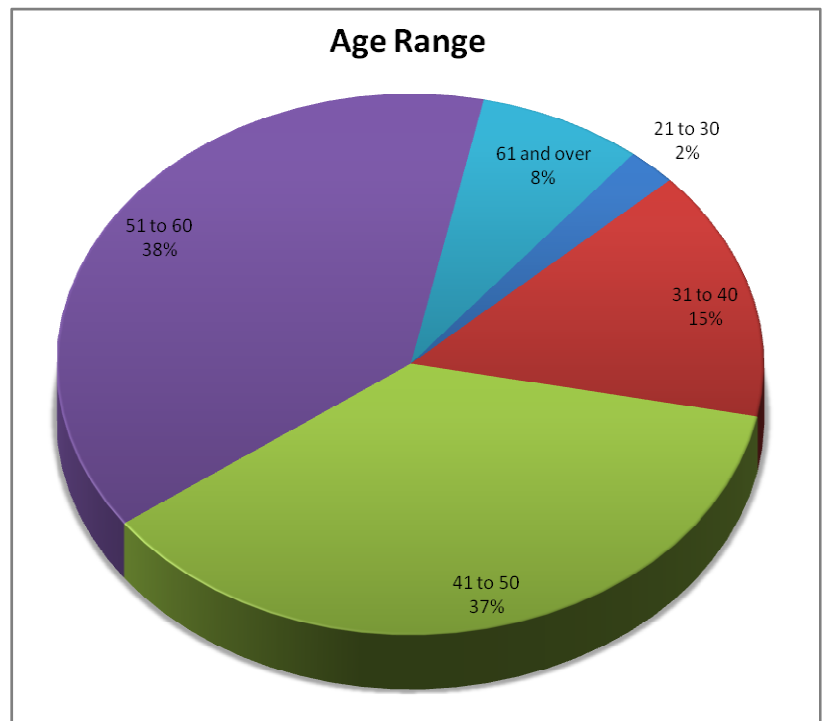


Figure 3: Age Range of Respondents

Thirty-eight percent of respondents identified their age range to be between 51 and 60 years old, 37 percent between 41 and 50 years old, 15 percent between 31 and 40 years old, 8 percent as 61 or over, and 2 percent as 21 to 30 years old, as shown in Figure 3.

Six values were coded as missing (the respondents declined to state).

Professional Background

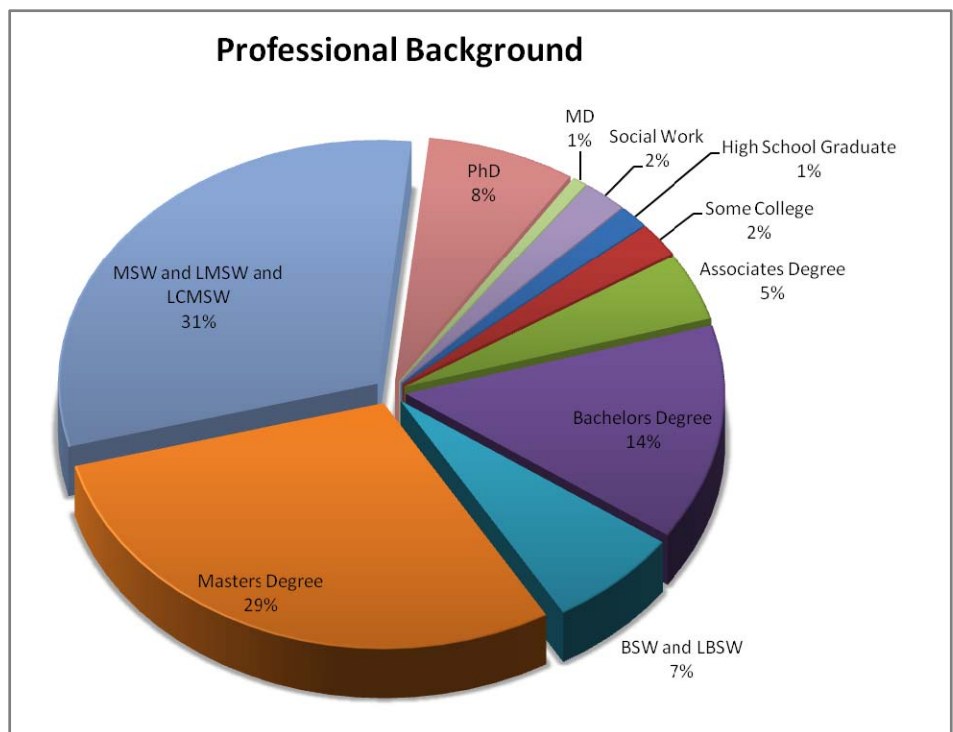


Figure 4: Professional Background of Respondents

As shown in Figure 4, 31 percent of respondents stated that they had a Masters degree in social work (including those who stated that they had "Licensed" or "Licensed Clinical" MSW). 29 percent stated that they had a Masters degree, 14 percent a Bachelors degree, 8 percent a PhD, 7 percent a Bachelors degree in social work (including "Licensed" BSW), 5 percent an Associates degree, and 1 percent an MD. 2 percent stated "social work", 2 percent stated "some college", and 1 percent "high school graduate".

Six values were coded as missing (the respondents declined to state).
